

Distribution box has two wires live and neutral





Overview

The Single Phase supply is 220Vac supply, which consists of 2 wires, one wire is Live and the other one is Neutral. These live and Neutral wires come from the distribution transformer to the energy meter and then directly connected to the main distribution board "MDB" in our homes. This guide describes wiring color codes, international standards, and main rules to keep in mind to work smarter and safer.

Live (L) Wire Connection: In a distribution box setup, the incoming live wire (also known as phase or hot wire, denoted as L or Line) connects to the line terminal of the circuit breaker. I've also seen some video on this type of box (image below) i think is a DIN RAIL or miniature panel (not sure of the name)

How do you do a 220 Installation because almost all the. In a typical North American home, the power delivered to your breaker box is split into two "hot" wires, L1 (Line 1) and L2 (Line 2). In Canadian service entrance panelboards the main switch or circuit breaker is located in a service box, a section of the enclosure separated from the rest of the panelboard, so that when the main switch or breaker is switched off no live parts are exposed when servicing the branch circuits.

6. AC wiring

This device has two triggers for activating its switch-off mechanism. A thermal trigger for long-term small overload currents, and a magnetic trigger for large short duration currents like short circuit currents.

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On mains AC, why is neutral different from live?

This contact is your "Live" wire. If you don't earth one terminal, you have an isolated supply. There is no live and neutral as such, just two wires

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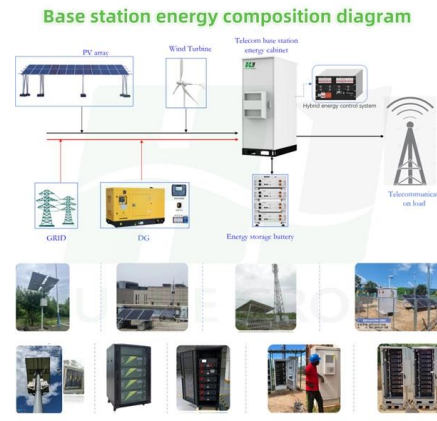
