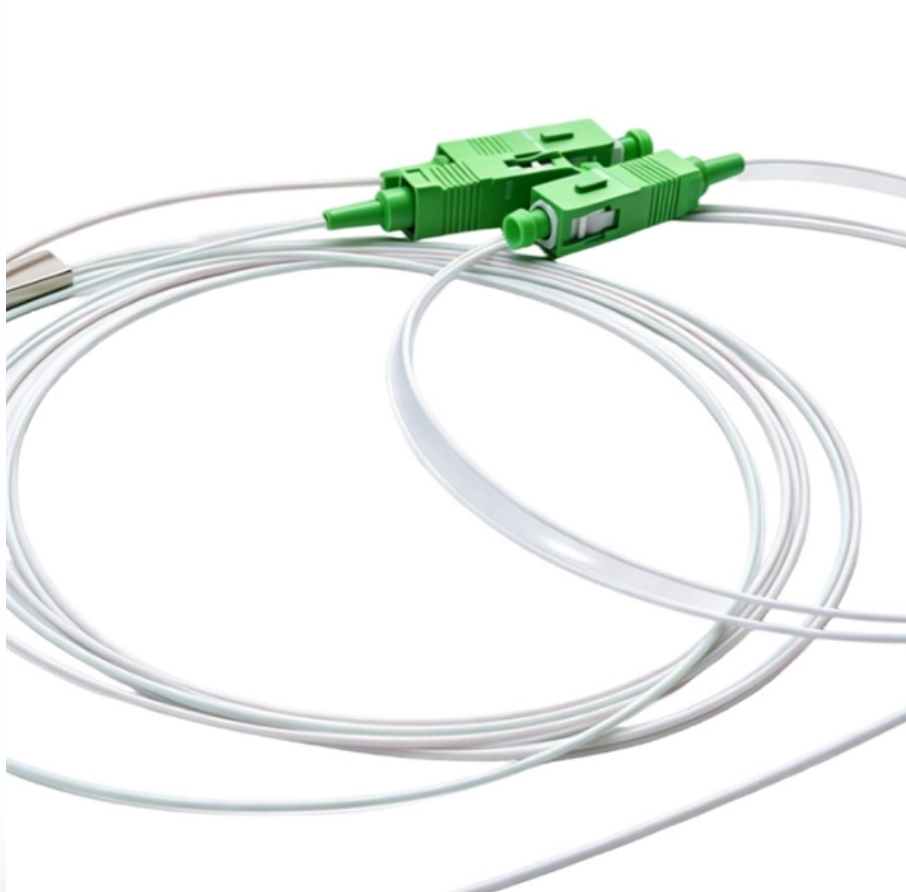

How a Home Grounding Rod Works and Is Installed

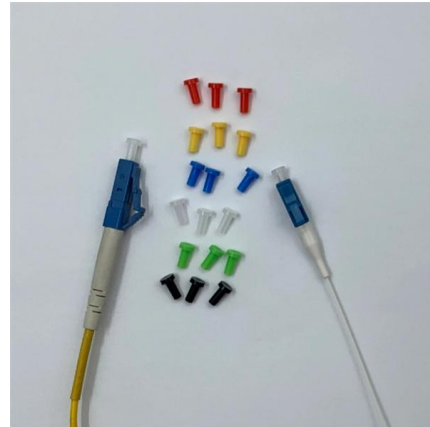
A home grounding rod is a long, conductive metal stake driven into the earth near the electrical service panel, serving as a direct connection between a home's electrical system and the

DISTRIBUTION BOX

Each DISTRIBUTION BOX and controller must be grounded. On the US market, a 5.26 mm² (10 AWG) ground wire must be used, and in all other markets a 6 mm² must be used.

When more than one rod electrode is used as part of a grounding electrode system, the NEC requires that the multiple ground rod spacing be at least 6 feet apart

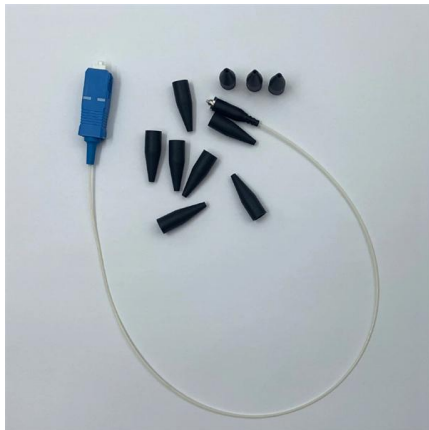

How to make repeated grounding of distribution box

Firstly, using $\varnothing 50$ galvanized steel pipe or $50 \times 50 \times 5$ galvanized angle iron around the distribution box, and make it 1.5~2 meters deep under the ground.

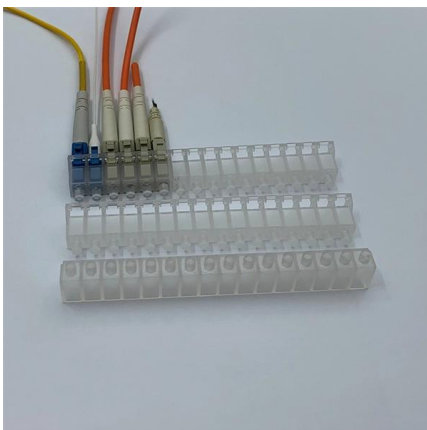

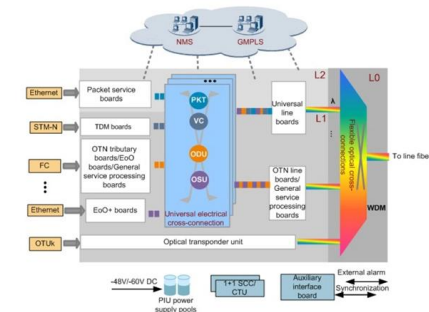
